Next week is a busy one for Year 3, 5 and 7 students who will all be participating in the NAPLAN testing. If your child is one of these, please talk to them and allay any fears they may have, as some children become very concerned about the tests. The value of these tests as far as we are concerned is as a diagnostic tool that allows us to see what students can do and the areas that they have still not achieved. We will then ensure we plan programs and learning experiences that address those understandings and continue their development based on results from NAPLAN tests and other assessment strategies we have in place, along with teacher observations and judgements.


Additionally, early nights and a good breakfast will help your child to do well.

Every Tuesday and Thursday morning, our Chaplain and some volunteers run a breakfast club in the Art room. This is an opportunity for students to have a bit of a quiet social time while they have something to eat and a drink. Students do not necessarily have had to miss breakfast to attend and can just drop in for an extra piece of toast or fruit drink should they wish.

Melissa Peden has recently distributed a notice about a parent workshop to give parents greater understanding about early literacy for pre-primary and year 1 students. We are delighted to have had an overwhelming response from parents. However, if you have a child in those years and would still like to attend, please return the cut-off section of the notice and return it to your child's teacher, or simply send a short note along indicating that you will be attending. We will be presenting information about the early literacy program we use at Maylands Peninsula, age appropriate milestones, how to help your child read and how to make home reading a positive experience for you and your child. The workshop will run between 9:00am and 10:30am and will be followed by light refreshments.
