Message from the Principal



Newsletters- A new approach

As discussed at the last P&C meeting, one of the areas of concern raised by the school community as part of our recent survey related to communication, particularly in respects to being kept informed of school related events.

Essentially, communication is a two way street. As such, there is an onus of responsibility that exists between the school and the community in order for things to work. Responsibility on behalf of the school to get the information out in a timely and efficient manner and a responsibility on behalf of parents/carers to access this information when it is has been made available.

The school newsletter is by far the primary and most efficient mode of communication between the school and home. However, school website data suggests that at most only 25% of our school community access the newsletter page on the school website. This means that up to 75% of our school community may not be aware of what is happening in the school, coming events etc which is of concern to me.

In response to this concern, the school will be trialling a new software package allowing us to deliver the newsletter direct to your inbox without the need to download a PDF file. This will increase the number of families able to access the newsletter directly via smartphone, tablet device, laptop or workstation.

Furthermore, the software will enable the school to monitor which families have successfully received the email and viewed the school newsletter. As is currently the case, limited copies of printed school newsletters will still be made available at the canteen and in the school office.

Information will be made available early next term to parents/carers about developments in this area. Your support is greatly appreciated.

IPad donations

At the assembly this morning, Mr Steve Brown from the Maylands Lions Club presented 8 new iPads to the school.

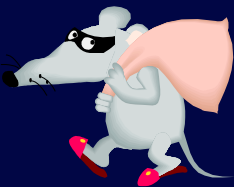
Road Safety
