Message from the Principal

Commencement of 2018 School Year

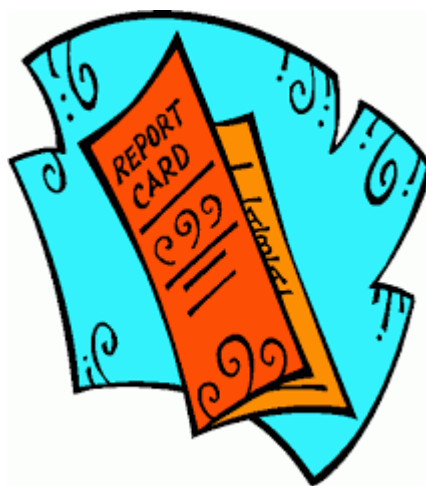


Thank You!
