Cybersafety sessions

Last Wednesday, Kirra Pendergast from Safe on Social Media spoke to our students about how to engage safely with the variety of social media platforms available in the on-line world. As part of this conversation with students, Kirra fielded quite a few questions about the Momo cyber challenge, as some students commented that they had seen it in Roblox and on Youtube.

Please keep your eyes and ears open about Momo. If your child asks, make sure that they know that the Momo challenges are made up to scare kids and that they are not real. Please advise them to tell you immediately so you can report it to the developers of the particular app that they have seen the Momo challenge on or to make contact with the Office of the eSafety Commissioner at esafety.gov.au. Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council's (EMRC) Battery Collection Programme



Batteries contain recyclable elements including carbon, zinc, manganese, lithium, nickel, copper and aluminium. They also contain hazardous materials which can pollute groundwater and soil. And yet, 94% of batteries are still disposed of in household rubbish bins.

The Eastern Metropolitan Regional Council's (EMRC) Battery Collection Programme began in 2003, and has grown from just 5 schools participating, to 97 across the region. Since 2012, these schools have diverted more than 30 tonnes of household batteries from landfill.

Maylands Peninsula Primary School has recently joined the Battery Recycling Programme. Students and their families are encouraged to collect used batteries and bring them to school. The batteries can be placed in the bin located in the school's library and the school office.

You can bring in the following batteries for recycling:

- Button batteries
- AA and AAA batteries
- C and D batteries
- 6V and 9V batteries

However, a \$15.00 fee will apply if you order more than 10 days after photography. You also have the option to order a sibling photo package online, however, please be aware there may be a limited number of sibling orders that can be placed due to time constraints on photo days. We suggest you place your online sibling order as early as possible to avoid disappointment.

This year Kapture is offering a \$35.00 budget pack which includes a class photo and multi portrait. This offer is only available through online ordering.

Please note sibling photo orders close on Friday, 7 September.

- "If you have a problem with that person, maybe you could sort it out with them."
- "If you're truly worried about that person, maybe you could talk to an adult."

You could also:

- Walk away

- Change the topic, or say something positive about the person.
- Imagine that what you are about to say will definitely get back to the person.

What Should You Do If Someone Gossips About You?

- Decide if you can let it go, or if you need to sort it out.
- Speak to the person (one-on-one) who started the rumour/gossip.
- Report the incident/speak to an adult if you feel you need to.
