Potential School Re-structure

As highlighted in the letter that was sent home via Smartlink and handpouches on Monday, the Leadership Team is currently assessing the impact of student arrivals and departures leading up to the 2020 Student Census taking place on Friday, 14 February.

As has always been the case, I would like to remind parents/caregivers that our current class structures are always temporary arrangements for the first few weeks of the school year. At the conclusion of the Student Census, the school Leadership Team will re-assess our overall position with a view towards making a decision about our class structures moving forward.

I would like to reiterate that no decision will be made about school structures until every student that is currently on our school roll has been accounted for.

I shall inform the school community of the outcome of this process via a letter home to all families once the school's staffing entitlement has been confirmed and class structures have been finalised. This will hopefully be sooner, rather than later. I appreciate your patience and understanding on this matter.

Coronavirus

There have been quite a few phone calls to the office seeking clarification regarding the Department of Education's position in respects to the coronavirus outbreak. In the original letter sent home on Monday afternoon, the Department asked families who have travelled through mainland China or Hong Kong, to stay at home for a

14 day exclusion period after having left mainland China or Hong Kong. Late on Monday afternoon, the Department altered its position to exclude Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan from this advice. This means that families that have travelled through mainland China are still required to follow the 14 day exclusion period. However, if you have travelled through Hong Kong, Macau or Taiwan, these rules no longer apply.

A reminder to all parents/caregivers that the Smartlink app is the primary method of electronic communication between the school and home as it

enables messages to be communicated quickly to our school community. For those families new to our school community, the Smartlink app was purchased by the school and P&C to provide an additional way to connect to our school community. All other existing means of communication e.g. newsletter, school website, notes coming home via handipouches etc continue to operate. The Smartlink app does not replace these existing means, just supplements them.

Mobile Phone Policy 'Off and Away'

Late last year, the State Government announced a new *Student Mobile Phones in Public Schools* policy to come into effect from the start of the 2020 school year. As we already have a mobile phone policy that meets these requirements, there will be no changes for our school.

Essentially, all students must have their mobile phones switched off and away whilst on school

grounds and hand them to their class teacher for safe keeping at the beginning of the school day. Phones will be returned at the end of the school day, but cannot be switched on again until the student has left school grounds



Handwriting



The Western Australian Curriculum (English) requires teachers to formally teach and assess aspects of students' handwriting. The overall aim is that all students develop a personalised, fluent and legible handwriting style that enables them to communicate effectively when writing for different purposes.

From 2020, NSW Foundation Script will be progressively implemented throughout the school, beginning with Kindergarten to Year 2 until full implementation in Year 6, 2024. The NSW Foundation Script was selected for the following reasons:

- Students learn a foundation style and then learn how to join letters to form a cursive script. This does away with the need to learn a completely new style when moving from printing to cursive writing.
- It is based on natural handwriting patterns (basic scribble patterns), and requires no retracing of letter parts.
- The NSW Foundation Script 'matches' with the script introduced to our students in Kindergarten as part of our whole school approach to spelling- the *Promoting Literacy Development (PLD)* programme.

Please speak with your child's classroom teacher if you would like to know more about the changes to our handwriting policy.

Before and After School Supervision

I would like to remind all families that the school does not provide before school supervision. As such, it would be appreciated that parents/caregivers not bring students to school earlier than 8.30am. Any student and family member/caregiver that arrives earlier than 8.30am, including our students and family members in Pre-primary, must make their way to the central courtyard area where they will be supervised by the Leadership Team. Students are not permitted on any playground equipment before school. Please do not drop off students earlier than 8.30am as this has the potential to put students at risk. Please make arrangements with a friend or neighbour for drop off, or alternatively speak with one of the Out of School Hours Care providers- Maylands Out-of-School Hours Care, Bayswater Out-of-School Hours Care or YMCA Maylands- to discuss before school arrangements. Information about these providers is available in the office.

At the conclusion of the school day, any students who haven't been collected by 3.15pm will either be brought to the office by staff for supervision, in the case of our younger students, or expected to make their own way to the office under their own steam for our older students. Contact with parents/caregivers will then be made by the office staff. For the safety of your children please do not make arrangements for your child(ren) to wait in car park areas or out on Gibbney Reserve for extended periods of time as this may put them at risk. They must come to the office.

Please contact a member of the office if you require any additional information about these arrangements.

After School Play

One of the unique aspects of our school is the opportunity to utilise the main playground areas at the end of the school day. This only adds to the great community feel we have at Maylands Peninsula Primary School. As we have a number of new families entering the school this year, I would like to remind everyone of the 'rules' governing after school play on the school playgrounds:



- Students will have access to the main playground area alongside the school oval up to 3.20pm (2.50pm on Tuesdays) provided their parents/caregivers are supervising their play. All unsupervised students are to make their way home or to the school office if they have not been collected.
- At 3.20pm, the school siren will sound as the signal to indicate that the playground areas are closed for the day. Parents/caregivers and students are to make their way off school site.
- Parents/caregivers who wish to continue with play, please make your way to the playgrounds located on Gibbney Reserve where drinking fountains and toilet facilities are located.
- Cleaning staff will commence the process of locking up toilet areas soon after the end of the school day. Furthermore, if cleaning staff are cleaning toilet areas, please respect the fact that these areas cannot be accessed for use. Please use the toilet facilities located on Gibbney Reserve.

Thanks to all those parents/caregivers who have been 'doing the right thing' when the 3.20pm (2.50pm on Tuesdays) siren sounds.

Voluntary Contributions and Charges



Voluntary Contributions and Charges form an integral part of the school's financial budget each year. These monies are used to purchase resources and materials as part of the Teaching and Learning programmes offered by staff and goes directly towards improving outcomes for children. In 2020, the School Board has approved a flat

rate of **\$45.00 per student for each child from Kindergarten to Year 6**. Please feel free to see Mrs Millar in the office to arrange payment at your earliest possible convenience if you have not already paid via the

Campion Personal Items List. At the request of parents/caregivers, reminder notices will be posted out throughout the year for those families who would prefer to pay their Voluntary Contribution and Charges later in the year once uniforms, booklists etc have been attended to.

Assembly

As has been the case in previous years, assemblies for students in Year 1-6 are held each Friday fortnight just after the commencement of the school day. Please note, we ring the siren 5 minutes earlier than normal at **8.40am**, in order to provide enough time for classes to attend the assembly and be back in rooms for the commencement of specialist programmes at 9.30am.

Each class teacher will award Merit Certificates at every assembly. Furthermore, you will also notice on the Term Planner that Excellence Awards and Aussie of the Month Awards will be presented on alternative assembly dates. We are again very fortunate to have the continued sponsorship of Perth Realty Group, who provide our Academic Excellence Award; Bosch Timber Flooring, who provide our Writer of the Month prize and the Maylands Peninsula Golf Club who supply our Science Excellence Award. Our senior classes will host the assemblies this term with Ms Turvey's S1 class the first class 'up to bat' on **Friday, 14 February**.

I look forward to seeing many members of our school community out in support throughout the year.

Late Arrivals/Early Pick Ups

As per the Department of Education's Attendance Policy, any student who arrives after the commencement of the school day at 8.45am will be asked to go to the office to collect a Late Slip. This will allow the school to keep an eye on issues regarding school tardiness. Conversely, any student that needs to be collected before the scheduled end of the school day at 3.00pm (2.30pm on early close Tuesday), will need an Early Departure Sticker from the office. Please do not be affronted if staff ask you to go to the office in the event that you front up to the classroom door without this sticker. The general rule is if you arrive late, or need to go early, pass by the office first. Thank you for your understanding on this matter.

Running Club

In 2020, Miss Wyatt, our Physical Education specialist, is keen to get a school running club up and running (Pardon the pun). Miss Wyatt will speak about the running club operations as part of her Physical Education lessons



next week. Below is some information about the running club aims and its operations.

Aim:

- Improve students' aerobic fitness and to explore how regular physical activity keeps individuals healthy and well.
- Give students an opportunity to set goals and be accountable for their own health and wellbeing.
- Create bonds with students within the school.
- Allow students to challenge themselves.
- Prepare students for Interschool Cross Country carnival in Term 2.

How:

- Students will run around the 400m running track (soccer goals on Gibbney Reserve).
- Each student will receive a unique QR code to keep track of how far they have run.
- Once students have completed 100km they will be presented with a certificate and badge at assembly.

Who:

- All students in Years 3-6.
- Miss Wyatt will be organising and running the MPPS Running Club.
- Faction Captains are in charge of setting up the course in the mornings and recording students' laps.

When:

- Every Friday morning 8:10-8:35am.
- Commencing in Term 1, Week 3.

Where:

- Meet Miss Wyatt near the drink fountain on Gibbney Reserve.

Questions and Answers:

Q: Do students have to run every lap, or can they walk some?

A: No, students do not have to run every lap. If students would like to walk laps that is fine.

Q: Do students have to come every Friday morning?

A: No, it is not compulsory to come. Students are able to come down whenever they like.

Q: Is there a minimum or maximum of how many laps students must run each morning?

A: No, students can run as much or as little as they want until 8:35am. At the conclusion of the session students will be sent off to class to prepare for the day.

Q: Do you need to sign up?

A: No, just turn up on Friday mornings after 8:10am with your QR code and start running!

Volunteering at the Canteen


