Maylands Multicultural Playgroup

At Maylands Peninsula Primary School, we are reducing the barriers to early childhood education and care through 'a soft-entry point' – the Maylands Multicultural Playgroup. The **Maylands Multicultural Playgroup** is a high quality supported playgroup, offered free of charge to multicultural families, with children up to 4 years old.

The playgroup is facilitated by educators, Mrs Vimini and Mrs Rai who use the Early Years Learning Framework; child development norms, and the [Abecedarian Approach Australia \(3a\)](#) to plan the playgroup in partnership with families. Their aim is to build on the children's social/emotional, language, and cognitive development through:

- games (that are based on child-development norms and are underpinned by pre-literacy and numeracy skills);
- open-ended activities that support oral language development;
- shared stories;
- intentionally adding 'educational' content to routines, such as changing nappies, washing hands, and eating and packing away.

Families are encouraged to use their home language with their child, ensuring children's continued development and learning, family connections, and strength of culture. The **Maylands Multicultural Playgroup** will be in operation over the next two and a half years as part of a trial programme initiated by the Department of Education.

Jeans 4 Genes Day

It was pleasing to see so many students and staff wearing their jeans to school today in support of 'Jeans 4 Genes Day'.

All up, the Student Councillors collected \$755.60.

This money will be sent to the Children's Medical Research Institute to help fund research to advance the prevention and treatment of genetic diseases.




