COVID update

Early next week, information will be sent home via Connect regarding vaccination requirements which come into effect at the start of the 2022 school year. Please read the information carefully, as it provides guidance about those instances where visitors entering the school site are required to provide proof of vaccination status.

Generally speaking, for the vast majority of parents/caregivers, you will **not be required** to provide evidence of your vaccination status. However, for those individuals who assist the school/P&C more than once a week e.g. assisting in the canteen, Uniform Shop or Support-a-Reader programs, evidence will be required. Furthermore, students **are not required** to be vaccinated.

Yummy holiday recess specials for Week 10

The last day of school is Thursday, 16 December. The Friday Pie Day will move to Thursday for one day only.

Our Bolognese Sauce Recipe

This is what we use for our homemade pasta Bolognese and Nachos Bolognese. This is a sneaky veg recipe not for Bolognese sauce purists.

Brown **1kg of beef mince** in a large saucepan with a little oil. Sprinkle with 2 tablespoons of dried onion (or add **2 finely chopped brown onions**). Grate **2 big zucchini** and **2 large carrots** and stir through the beef. Add some **finely chopped celery** and **capsicum** if you have any in the fridge that needs using up. Add a

400g tin of chopped tomatoes and a tin full of water. Add **250g of tomato paste** (if you have a 500g jar of paste, put it all in. Lycopene in cooked tomatoes is a super food). Add 1 tablespoon of **paprika** (for extra redness), 1 tablespoon dried **oregano**, 1 and a half teaspoons of **salt** and 1 teaspoon of **pepper**. Give it all a stir and let it cook on low heat for an hour (or two). Half of it can go in the freezer for later.

Spoon onto cooked pasta and no pressure to make a salad to go with it!

Add salsa to a portion to sauce, spoon over an oven-proof dish of corn chips, sprinkle with grated cheese, bake at 200 degrees for 20 minutes for a Nachos dinner.

Add a tin of drained beans to a portion of sauce and heat through and serve with rice or Cous Cous and call it Chilli Con Carne.
