2023 Kindergarten enrolments cut off- Friday, 22 July 2022.

Our community is reminded that Kindy and Preprimary enrolments for 2023 close on **Friday, 22 July** (Week 1, Term 3). Children starting Kindergarten need to be 4 years old by 30 June 2023, whilst children starting Pre-primary need to be 5 years old by 30 June 2023. **Please Note: Students who are currently enrolled in the school's Pre-primary programme will be automatically enrolled in our Year 1 programme commencing in 2023.**

The following documentation must be provided when you come in to complete a formal enrolment form for a new student:

- Proof of residence to be lodged with your application (e.g. council rates notice or rental agreement longer than three months and current utilities bill or bank statement).
- Your child's birth certificate/passport/visa, child's up to date immunisation records and child's medical information (asthma, allergies etc.)
- Parents' passport and visa details if born overseas.

Please see Mrs Tippett in the school office if you require any further clarification.

Thank you to the MPPS community who bought socks from the P&C's popular pop-up sock stalls, which finished with the final sale yesterday.


Another big thank you to volunteers who gave up their precious time to help with the stalls.
