However, as stated above, this will be subject to change depending on student arrival and departure at the start of next year.

On behalf of the school community, I would like to thank Alison for her years of service to the families of our school and wish her well in her retirement. In respects to returning staff, I'd like to welcome back Mrs Natalie O'Connor (EL2) and Mrs Sharna Reed (JB2) who are returning to Maylands Peninsula PS after Parental Leave. I would also like to welcome Mrs Lisa Shepherd (EL3), Miss Riley Davidson (S5) and Mrs Ella Britton (Junior Art) who will be joining our staff for the first time in 2023.

As this is the final newsletter of the year, I would like to thank our entire school community for another great year. We have a somewhat different start to the school year in 2023, with students not returning to school until **Wednesday, 1 February 2023**. The office will be open from Wednesday, 25 January onwards, but closed on the Australia Day holiday on Thursday, 26 January.

Sustainability Update 2022

Thanks to everyone who has brought in their bottle caps, oral care, bread tags and stationery to the MPPS recycling station during 2022. Together we have saved a lot of waste from landfill that has been recycled and reused. A breakdown of the totals includes:

- Plastic lids – 40 kg
- Stationery – 8.5 kg
- Oral care – 10 kg
- Bread tags – 2.5 kg
- Dish and air care – 1.5 kg

The recycling station will be packed away next week so please bring any items for the recycling station in by **Monday, 12 December.**

If you are doing a cleanout at home over the holidays there are several options for reuse or recycling both locally and at most major shopping centres including:

- . **Good quality items** (clothing, furniture, books, toys):
- . Gift through your local Buy Nothing page on Facebook.
- . Donate to local op-shops

Items not good enough to gift/donate:

- . Clothing – Recycle all clothing brands that are not of good enough quality to donate at H&M stores.
- . Sneakers – Recycle all brands of worn-out sports shoes at participating Rebel Sports stores (Rebel at Morley Galleria has a box).
- . Toys - Recycle all brands of toys not good enough to gift or broken toys for free at Big W Toys for Joy (Belmont Forum). Can recycle metal toys (cars), soft toys, electronic toys (batteries must be removed) and plastic toys.
- . Beauty products - Recycle any brand of used beauty or makeup packaging at participating Priceline (Belmont Forum), Mecca (Myer Perth and Forrest Chase) and David Jones. Packaging should be empty.
- . Wet suits – Rip Curl stores in WA (Carousel, Scarborough, Joondalup and Margaret River) will accept any brand of used wet suits for recycling.

We look forward to continuing to work together next year to make our school more sustainable now and into the future. Finally, we would like to extend our thanks to Karen Haywood for establishing the sustainability program for the P&C and for her commitment to the school and local community. We will miss you at MPPS!

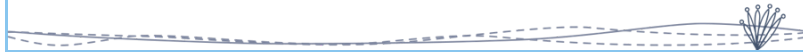
