It is with mixed emotions that I announce to the school community that next week will be Mrs Rosemary Johnson's last week at Maylands Peninsula PS.

In 2004, Mrs Johnson was a foundation staff member of Maylands Peninsula PS. Before this, she had been part of the old East Maylands PS staff since 1998. This means that Mrs Johnson has spent well over 25 years working within the Maylands community, initially as a classroom teacher, but later as a school administrator.

Her passion for working with students, particularly those who experience some challenges for whatever reason, is only matched by her commitment to her beloved Fremantle Dockers. She always finds time within her very busy day to offer support and guidance to students, staff and parents/caregivers alike. Mrs Johnson has taken responsibility for leading our Student Services portfolio-liaising with therapists and outside support agencies, organising our senior student camp to Bridgetown and more recently Dwellingup, assisting the students on our Student Council and is our school liaison with Instrumental Music Services. Quite simply, Mrs Johnson has been a key part of the fabric of our school community and has seen us grow from a relatively small metropolitan primary school with 280 students to where we are today at just over 740.

acknowledge her fine work, not only this year, but in all years. There is a big hole in our school that will take some filling.

# 2024 Kindergarten enrolments cut off- Friday, 21 July 2023.

Our community is reminded that Kindy and Preprimary enrolments for 2024 close on **Friday, 21 July** (Week 1, Term 3). Children starting Kindergarten need to be 4 years old by 30 June 2024, whilst children starting Pre-primary need to be 5 years old by 30 June 2024. **Please Note: Students who are currently enrolled in the school's Pre-primary program will be automatically enrolled in our Year 1 program commencing in 2024.** 

As Pre-primary is the first compulsory year at school, all current Kindergarten children who reside within our local-intake area will have a guaranteed Pre-primary place for 2024. However, in order to secure a place, parents/caregivers will need to come up to the office and sight the original enrolment application used to enrol your child(ren) in Kindergarten, note any changes (if any), and then sign and date the documents. By completing this process, parents/caregivers will secure a place for Pre-primary in 2024 and the school will be able to plan classes accordingly.

Unfortunately, parents/caregivers of children currently enrolled in Kindergarten who live outside the school's local-intake area will be required to apply for Preprimary in 2024 by **Friday, 21 July.** It is at this stage that all applications are assessed against the Department of Education's *Enrolment* policy. The policy assigns a particular priority order by which all applications are assessed before a place is offered to any child.

The following documentation must be provided when you come in to complete a formal enrolment form for a new student:

- Proof of residence to be lodged with your application (e.g. council rates notice or rental agreement longer than three months and current utilities bill or bank statement).
- Your child's birth certificate/passport/visa, child's up to date immunisation records and child's medical information (asthma, allergies etc.)
- Parents' passport and visa details if born overseas.

Please see Mrs Nielsen or Mrs Reddish in the school office if you require any further clarification.

# **Building Condition Assessment- Drone activity** above the school

Building Condition Assessments (BCA) are carried out at all schools at regular intervals as part of the Department of Education's overall asset management strategy.

In addition to the inspection of buildings and internal areas, aerial surveys using drones are used to capture footage of roof condition and coverings, including penetration points, box gutters and safety anchor points.

The Department of Finance have engaged licensed drone operators from Duratec Australia who will conduct these surveys at our school site. Drone operators will be wearing uniform and carry appropriate identification. The drone will operate within the school area to capture buildings, ovals, carparks, and surrounding street parking bays. The drone will ensure the privacy of neighbouring properties (i.e. not show private spaces in photos or videos, such as backyards).

Drones will operate during daylight hours, typically between 6.00am and 6.00pm weekdays, on weekends or during school holidays. Drone operators are required to comply with the necessary insurances and certifications including:

- current Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) safety rules and requirements; and
- the relevant Remote Pilot License (RePL) and a Remotely piloted aircraft Operator's Certificate (ReOC) certification.

All drone footage will be stored and maintained for internal use only.

Therefore please do not be concerned if you see drones flying over the school.




