## **MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL**





Motion for the re-zoning of the Gibbney Reserve Pavilion

As many parents/caregivers would know, for more than two years the school, in collaboration with our local South Ward councillor, parent and Board member, Mr Elli Petersen-Pik, have been actively engaged with the City of Bayswater to investigate the possibility of re-zoning the Gibbney Reserve Pavilion to provide the opportunity for the vacant office space at the northern end of the building to be utilised as an Out-of-School Hours care facility.

At the Council meeting on Tuesday night, the motion put forward by Councillor Petersen-Pik was put to the vote. After some spirted discussion, the council was split evenly (5-5) at the end of the initial round of voting. In order to break the deadlock, the mayor used her casting vote to put the issue to rest.

I would like to thank Elli, Ms Nat Latter- parent and South Ward councillor, the School Board, P&C and concerned members of our school community who advocated so strongly on our behalf and/or signed the petition in favour of the motion. Whilst we didn't get the result we were hoping for, it wasn't through a lack of effort or will.


In early 2024, information about filling the vacant two parent representative positions will be communicated out to the school community.




