2024 anticipated numbers and 2023 staffing and class structures

In respects to planning for the 2024 school year, it is anticipated that our total school population for the commencement of the year will be around **720.** This is a similar enrolment to what we started the 2023 school year.

This will mean that we will commence the school year with a **32** class arrangement from Kindy- Year 6. However, this will be subject to change depending on student arrival and departure at the start of next year. The 2024 class structures will not be confirmed until we have completed the 2024 Student Census in mid-February. As such, do not mark items of personal equipment with a teacher name or room number until such time as the Leadership Team confirms our 2024 class structures.

We have several members of staff retiring at the end of the year. I would like to acknowledge Mrs Alice Parcej-Collins (Kindy), Mrs Teresa Ferguson (Year 2) and Mr Dave Sollis (Year 6) for over 20 years of service to the Maylands Peninsula PS community. Visual and Performing Arts Night-Thursday, 30 November






